Executive Summary

Introduction:

Govt. Mahaprabhu Vallabhacharya P.G. College was established by "Bagbahara Sikshan Samiti" at Mahasamund in the year 1965. On Sep 11, 1981, this college was taken over by the State Government. New phase of development of this college started after the takeover by the government. Currently the college is also serving as the lead and nodal college of all the colleges in Mahasamund district.

At present, college is offering UG courses in Arts, Science, Commerce and Computer Application along with PG courses in subjects of Hindi, English, Political Science, History, Economics, Sociology, Commerce, Chemistry, Botany, Mathematics, Zoology and Physics are also taught in this college. Across the Mahasamund district this college is the only educational institute which runs research centers (in the department of Hindi and Political Science) for Ph.D scholars.

Visualizing the importance of Computer Literacy, cources like DCA, PGDCA and PGDYEP (Post Graduate Diploma in Yoga Education and Philosophy) are run through Self-finance scheme.

The vision of the college is manifested in the old epigram "Vidya Dharmen Shobhate" which means education allied with piety and righteousness is sublime. Criteria wise Summary

Curricular Aspects :

Government Mahaprabhu Vallabhacharya P.G. College Mahasamund (C.G.) follows the curriculum prescribed by its affiliating University, Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University Raipur (C.G). Our college is recognized under 2(f) and 12(b). It is the biggest institute in the Mahsamund district in terms of offering highest number of courses in various streams. The institution is offering four UG Programs under Arts, Science, Commerce and Computer Science Streams, where as twelve P.G programs are offered in Hindi, English, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, History, Commerce, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, Botany and Mathematics. One UG and two PG Diploma courses in DCA, PGDCA, and PGDYEP are offered respectively. College has two research centers in subjects of Hindi and Political Science.

In the beginning of the every new session college prepare its own academic calendar based on the academic schedule prepared by C.G. Higher Education Department. Activities such as student orientation, literary, cultural, & sports programs are done as per college academic calendar. Continuous Internal assessments are also conducted on specified time.

During the last five years six Professors from this institute have been made members of University BOS. Faculty members actively participate in academic activities such as question paper setting, answer sheet evaluation and various training program conducted by university. This institute also imparts the important responsibility of university valuation center. All teachers prepare teaching plan according to the prescribed syllabus and complete it within the time limit. The college has ICT facility for effective curriculum delivery. Class room teaching is supplemented with departmental quiz, seminar, group discussion etc.

Value Added Courses are being offered by college to enhance the skill based quality of students. Recently college has conducted Value Added course in areas of Yoga, management, soft skill and basic computer knowledge which benefited many students. Crosscutting issues are imparted to students through various drives such as seminars, rallies, camps, plantation and celebration of social and environmental specific days. Feedback is taken from all stakeholders. After the analysis of feedback, necessary steps are taken to cater the need of students.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation :

Govt. Mahaprabhu Vallabhacharya P.G. College is lead college of Mahasamund district which provides quality education to more than 4000 students. Admissions are given to student according to the admission rule of C.G. Government and affiliating university. Students are admitted on the basis of merit list prepared by university, where reservation policy is followed and students from ST, SC, OBC, PWD, FF are given proper representation. Final admission selection list is displayed on college website and notice board. Enrollment of ST/SC/OBC & Female student is more which is indicator of healthy and robust environment of the college campus.

Faculty members are highly qualified and fulfill the norms of UGC and Higher education department of Chhattisgarh. College has teaching staff of 30 professors, out of which 02 Professors are D.Litt. 08 professors are Ph.D and remaining Assistant Professors are either NET, SET or M.Phil. Presence of competent and dedicated staff plays vital role in developing robust atmosphere for teaching, learning and research activities in college campus.

In college along with conventional method of teaching use of ICT and other modern teaching aids are being used. To enhance the teaching learning process classroom discussion, quiz, debate, invited lectures, seminars, webinars, field visit, educational tour, exhibition, industrial visit are also done.

The college has a transparent, time bound and efficient mechanism to deal with examination related grievances. Every year College students have been securing place in university merit list. Total 22 students of the college

secured position in university merit list in academic session 2021-22. College ensures to display Program Outcomes and Course Outcomes on college notice board and website.

College has made efforts to offer value and skill based programs and courses to its student. In this attempt college has conducted value added course on soft skill, basic computer skill, embroidering & bakery and, beauty parlor course. During last five years college has been offering course on DCA, PGDCA and Yoga.

Research, Innovations and Extension :

In order to create ideal research environment the college has formed Research Development Cell (RDC). RDC encourages college faculty and students to take up research activities by utilizing their inherent skills. It also offers valuable assistance to college students and faculty member in writing and publishing their research paper, and preparing project proposal. The college has 02 research centers (Hindi and Political Science) recognized by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University. 05 faculty members are registered as research guides. In last five years faculty members have made ardent efforts to publish research paper in recognized journals. The college has conducted 02 national seminars and many national/international webinars in last five years.

The college has active NSS, NCC, and Youth Red Cross units through which different extension activities are carried out such as participation in Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Fit Indian Abhiyan, Blue Briged Abhinav Yojna, Collaboration of NSS with UNICEF, Gender Issue, Cyber Crime, Free health check up camp, Mega camp, Blood Donation Camp, SVEEP, AIDS Awareness etc.

College NSS Unit had organized MEGA CAMP where students from six colleges and schools took active participation. Mega Camp ran for seven days where students carried out many social, environmental and health awareness activities.

During the COVID 19 pandemic college student under the banner of NSS & YRC served the needy people of society by providing them mask, sanitizers, groceries, and other life saving stuffs. Students even compromised their safety to provide helping hand in vaccination centers. Under the banner of YRC college has organized COVID19 vaccination camp to mitigate the effect of pandemic. For making this distinguished contribution towards society NSS Boys Unit received both best NSS boy's unit award and best NSS Program officer award. YRC Program officer is also awarded by governor of Chhattisgarh.

College well concerned about its responsibilities towards environmental conservation and for this it has run various environmental protection drives. Therefore, college is two times recipient of GREEN CHAMPION AWARD by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Higher Education Department Government of India.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources :

The institution has its own lush green campus area which offers ample infrastructural facilities for teaching, learning, cultural, and sports activities. College runs in two shifts. In the morning shift department of commerce, computer science and yoga operates. Departments of science and arts are run during the day shift.

There is a separate departmental room for each department in the college. Each department is equipped with computing resources like desktop computers with internet connectivity. The Computers are connected with printers and scanners wherever required.

The college has 15 classrooms with ample furniture for sitting arrangements of student. There are 08 classrooms which equipped with ICT facilities such high speed internet connectivity & LCD projectors. One class room is developed as a smart room where students are taught through the use of digital board. College campus is

completely covered with IT/Wi-Fi connectivity. To strengthen the internet speed college has installed separate router in areas of importance such as Science Building, Arts building, RUSA building and Auditorium. This connectivity is also available in Principal room, College office, NAAC/IQAC room, PSC Coaching Center, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Computer Labs. Commerce Department has separate computer lab with internet connectivity of 200mbps

College has one main library, and each P.G. Department has its own departmental Library. Library automation work is under progress (Software SOUL 3.0). Our college has subscription of N-List. Our college gives access to N-list to all college faculty and PG students through ID and password. All departments of science stream have separate laboratories equipped with latest instruments. The institute has 60 sitters Girl's Hostel which avails all necessary facilities. There is a guard room in the main entrance of the college. One girl's common room is available for girl students. College auditorium has capacity of holding 800 audiences; it also has separate washrooms for male and female students. The College has its own mini stadium for sports and cultural activities. Open Gym of college has all necessary tools and equipments for open exercising.

Student Support and Progression :

College provides scholarship facility to its all SC/ST/OBC /GIR students. During last five years 8000 students have been financially benefited through scholarship which is more than 75 percent of total registered students of the college. In admission all girl students are exempted from tuition fee under the provisions mentioned in admission rule. College also distributes necessary stationery items such as notebook and pen to the students belonging to ST and SC category.

To enhance Capacity and skill Development in Students College has organised various program such as Value Added Course, Computer Training, Soft Skill Program, sewing training, beauty parlour course, bakery training ,Yoga , Zumba training and etc. To promote life skill amongst student free health check-up camp and blood donation camps have been organised in the campus.

College has active career guidance cell which guides student in their career building. During last five years college has availed numerous career opportunities to more than four thousand students under the banner of career guidance cell. College runs free PSC Coaching class where numerous students get opportunity to prepare for competitive examinations.

Institution has transparent mechanism for timely remedy of grievances. Student complaints are received through complaint box which is opened weekly by members of grievance redressal cell in presence of college students. After registering the complaints grievances are redressed within stipulated time.

Students of the college get enrolled in higher education courses such as PG, M.Phil and Ph.D. The college students are also imparting their duties in govt. and non govt. bodies of the society. College Students have received awards/medals in state, national and international level tournaments.

Students are actively involved in various major committees of college such as Janbhagidari, IQAC, and etc .Student council is constituted as per the rules and regulations of affiliating university and state government.

To facilitate PWD students of college Separate wheel chair, ramps, furniture and toilets are available in the college. College has registered alumni association which plays significant role to provide financial and other necessary facilities to the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management :

All activities in college are done keeping the vision and mission in the mind. The quality, policy and plans are prepared and implemented by collective administrative plan which includes the principal, head of departments, IQAC Coordinator and members. Due to its effective institutional governance, during last five years college has managed to introduce new subject and course options such as BCA, Geography, Yoga, M.Sc. in Physics and Zoology. Intake capacity of students has been increased every year. Skill based initiatives like soft skill, basic computer training, accounting and management training has been offered in college campus itself. College saw infrastructural growth by receiving funds from UGC, RUSA and JBS. College has taken initiation towards E-Governance practices such as Website Updating, Online Admission, CCTV Monitoring, etc. Campus area is completely covered by high speed internet connectivity. Staff council of the college meets periodically to invite suggestions on developmental issues. The college administration keeps proper documentation and maintenance of records.

College has framed strategy for managing the core activities of the college such as evaluation of learning outcome is done through continuous internal assessment, Strengthening of Research activities done through research development cell. To inculcate cultural and social values in student Sahityik Sanskriti Samiti periodically conducts student centric programs for students.

The Institute offers worthwhile welfare schemes to all the teaching and non-teaching staff to ensure and provide thrust to their working efficiency. Welfare schemes include group insurance, festival advance, Ex-gratia, and leaves such as casual leave, medical leave, maternity leave etc. The performance of faculty is assessed through the Annual Performance Appraisal System (API). Both teaching and non-teaching staff are encouraged to participate in various training programs organised by govt. and non govt. bodies.

The institution has a mechanism to get students and staffs feedbacks. There is also a system to analyze feedbacks. The IQAC plays an important role in ensuring quality in the functioning of all units of the college. In order to make the students as well as teaching and non-teaching staff aware of the current and futuristic challenges and opportunities numerous steps has been taken by the College IQAC.

Institutional Values and Best Practices :

In our college, enrollment of girl student is higher than the boy student which clearly reflects the healthy gender equity in campus. Aspects of gender equity and sensitization are included in curriculum which is imparted through lectures, discussions and other interactive activities. Girl's common room offers personal space to girl student for doing recreational activities.

College is well aware of the problems being faced by divyangjans in the college campus. Therefore, arrangements of Ramp, Wheel chair, and other basic facilities for differently able students are being made in the college campus

College is highly sensitive towards environment protection and sustainability therefore it never misses out to celebrate various days like World Environment Day, World Ozone Day etc. Environmental awareness drives such as plantation, rain water harvesting, vermin compost, plastic pledge etc have been frequently practiced in college. To analyze the environmental conservation practices environmental audits such as green audit, energy audit and water audit has been done.

Our first best practices "*Efforts to develop green campus with sustainable management*" aims to create a campus that is free of plastic, generates little waste, use energy efficiently, and protects diversity.

Through our second best practice *Encouraging Girls' Education*, college works to develop an educational system for girls' students that will increase access and encourage enrollment in higher education.

The college maintains its distinctness "Academic Excellence with Social Consciousness". The students who pass out from this college are competent enough to full fill their professional responsibilities along with social

Institutional preparedness for NEP	
1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Govt. MVPG College is affiliated with Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University and strictly follows its guidelines and norms both in letters and spirit. The institute adopts mechanism of continuous internal assessment through process of evaluation and examination. Students are evaluated through question answer session, group discussion, poster presentation, assignments, project work, field visit, punctuality and regularity. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is timebound and efficient

Answer:

Evaluation is an integral part of teaching-learning process. University guidelines are strictly adhered to with respect to evaluation process. The college also follows the modalities of conducting the continuous internal evaluation (CIE) as prescribed by Pt. Ravishankar shukla University, Raipur, Chhattisgarh.

The college prepares academic calendar by including internal assessment, and the university examination. The institutional internal evaluation system is decentralized in order to make it more transparent and objective.

A Standard operating procedure has been in practice for the conduct of various internal examinations. In order to ensure transparency in internal assessment, the system of internal assessment is communicated with the students well in time.

The examination cell performs following functions to maintain transparency and robustness of examination procedure:-

Time table and topics for examination are displayed on the notice board and Whatsapp adequately in advance. Question papers for all tests and assignment are linked with course outcomes (COs). For internal examination, syllabus is declared by subject teacher and semester end examination is conducted on entire syllabus. The question papers are verified to eliminate errors and after moderation handed over to the examination in charge. Supervision duty chart is drafted and informed to teachers. Attendance of students is maintained properly during examination.

The progress and performance of the students are monitored by their performance in attendance, class tests, assignments, study projects and internal assessment examinations. The students are given valued answer scripts for their perusal to make them aware of the errors and to satisfy themselves about the valuation. Then

the marks are entered in the register. This also gives an opportunity for the students to perform better and become competent learners. The internal complaint cell addresses the grievances and all the grievances are promptly attended. The results are monitored by the HODs of respective departments.

Apart from university prescribed methods like assignments and tutorials, more relevant methods such as midterm examinations, power point presentations, project work etc. are experimented in the internal assessment. As per the academic calendar, tentative schedule is prepared and displayed on the notice board, website and on the WhatsApp group of the classes

External Assessment

Theory or Practical examinations are conducted by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University (PRSU). The marks allocated for each subjects are as per the syllabus structure. PRSU prepares and shares examination schedules to affiliated colleges.

To maintain transparency in the Practical Examination University appoints external examiner. In association with external examiner, internal examiner conducts Practical examination. Affiliating university appoints flying squad to monitor and to prevent use of unfair means in the examination.

Mechanism to deal with Internal Examination Related Grievances:

The institute has a well-organized mechanism for redressal of examination related grievances. The student can approach the subject teachers to redress the examination related grievance. If a student is not able to appear for examination due to medical or any genuine reason, he/she can give the examination later as per norms of the institute, provided that he/she submits application with proper documents.

2.6.1 Programme Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) for all Programmes offered by the institution are stated and displayed on website

Answer:

The institution follows the curriculum prescribed by Pt. Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur. The expected learning outcomes are identified and stated taking into account the institutional vision and mission as well.

After completion of the admission process, the syllabus and curriculum are provided to the students. Hard and soft copy of syllabi and learning outcomes are available in the respective departments, college website for teachers and students. Learning Outcomes of the Programs and Courses are displayed on the notice board at the beginning of the academic session. These delineate the knowledge and skills that a student should possess upon completion of the programme . Every year examination results display outstanding performance of students of this institution, who largely occupy the merit positions in the University Merit List.

Department meetings with Principal and IQAC are held at the beginning of the academic session to discuss the teaching plans and course outcomes specified for the courses. POs, PSOs and COs are also displayed on the college notice board for the perusal of all stakeholders. Also, Evaluation and attainment of POs, PSOs and COs are reviewed in the department meetings with the Principal at the end of every session.

Some faculty members are members in Board of Studies (BOS) at the university level thus contributing to discussions on programmes and course outcomes. Faculty members are taught to design assessments that

go in tandem with Programme Outcomes and to map the Course Outcomes with Programme Outcomes.

Course Outcomes: A course objective describes what a faculty member will cover in a course. They are generally less broad than desirable goals and broader than student learning outcomes. The course outcome is a detailed description of what a student must be able to do at the conclusion of a course. The course outcomes help the stakeholders to manage the resources effectively to the maximum extent.

Programme Outcomes: The work put into establishing the vision, purpose, and goals of the program should help provide direction for creating program outcomes. Basically, it is necessary to take those goals and translate them into tangible, 'measurable' outcome statements. For every degree programme, expectations are listed out by the institution under the Program Outcomes. This enables the stakeholders to identify and analyze complex problems. They also learn to design solutions for problems that meet the specified needs with appropriate consideration for the cultural, societal and environmental well-being.

Program Specific Outcomes: The outcomes which are specific to a program are identified and stated. The PSOs are defined, explained and stated and are displayed along with COs and POs. For each program offered by the college, a unique set of learning outcomes have been defined. These are linked to the broad programme outcomes. Following effective pedagogic strategies, the faculty articulates the learning objectives and expected outcomes for each programme . This enables the students to understand the Program Specific Outcomes and achieve the outcome.

Continuous assessment provides feedback for the efficacy of the teaching –learning process and learning outcomes of each course.

Course Outcomes: The course outcomes help the stakeholders to manage the resources effectively to the maximum extent. The attainment of course outcomes is demonstrated through seminars, communication skill programmes, assignments, projects, fieldwork etc. The course outcomes are directly evaluated on the basis of internal and external examination results.

Programme Outcomes: The program outcomes are assessed by examinations; annual and end semester, assignments, projects, viva, seminars etc., student progression and employer & alumni feedbacks . Each question paper prepared for an exam will be mapped to one or more COs which effectively will help to determine the achievement by each students in the exams.

Every question is mapped to a CO and every CO is mapped to a PO. Similarly, in each assessment methods, the final results and conclusions are used in arriving at how much the students have attained the COs & POs.

The stakeholders learn to design solutions for problems that meet the specified needs with appropriate consideration for the cultural, societal and environmental well-being. They apply reasoning and understand the impact of the solutions in societal and environmental context. They learn to apply ethical principles and become committed to professional ethics and their responsibilities. They understand the importance of critical thinking, social interaction, effective citizenship, environmental ethics and sustainability. Ultimately, they acquire the ability to engage in independent and life-long learning.

Programme Specific Outcomes: The institution evaluates the stakeholders as University Rank Holders, students representing college at University, National, International Sports events, curricular and extracurricular activities at various platforms. They are recognized and awarded during the Annual Day function by giving them certificates, mementos. The program outcomes and program specific outcomes are measured by conducting three Unit test, half yearly exam and pre-final examination as per Academic Calendar released by the Directorate of Higher Education and the affiliating university.

- **Computer Lab** Department of Computer Science has separate computer lab of 37 computers and Department of commerce has 10 computer in their computer lab.

3. Sports, Yoga and Gym Facility

- **Yoga-** Yoga Department has separate class room for practicing yoga and running classes for PG Diploma in Yoga Education & Philosophy.
- **Sports Activities**-The College has a mini stadium of 161.55 X 126.15 meter for outdoor activities/ sports which carries athletic track of 200 meters. Procedures and Strategies- The institution has formulated strategic and perspective plan in order to accurately achieve the Vision and Mission of the institute. Each strategic process is regularly reviewed by monitoring mechanism.

Strategy to Strengthen Teaching and Learning Domains- In order to attend excellence in teaching domain all teachers prepare teaching plan according to the prescribed syllabus and completes it within the time limit. Class room teaching is supplemented with ICT facility, departmental quiz, seminar, group discussion etc. The college has large library with numerous books and news papers. This proforma asks questions like number of publications in research papers, books, seminars, conferences, number of teaching hours, and related activities. 6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Answer:

Primarily institution receives fund from various sources, like the state government (for Infrastructure, books, furniture, laboratory, salary and etc), fund from fee collection (college development fund, library, sports, etc), and donations. College also receives fund from UGC, RUSA, JBS and SELF FINANCE COMMITTEE. For the proper utilization of resources budget is prepared in the beginning of every new session based on budget provisions made by state government. Govt. purchase rules are followed to monitor the effective and efficient use of available financial resources. Similarly, UGC, RUSA and other funds are managed as per the directions and norms of the concerning agencies. Janbhagidari Samiti makes significant financial contribution. Funds from jabhagidari samiti are demanded by student and other stake holders in JBS meeting to meet the immediate requirement of teaching and other student need. The maintenance and repair work is to be done by PWD and JBS Committee because the institute is a government funded organization. Self finance committee provides fund for running courses like PGDCA, DCA and YOGA, its fund is also utilized for recruiting Self Finance lecturers, purchasing necessary tools and utensils for teaching-learning purpose.

Mechanism for internal and external audit

Internal Audit- For the purpose of internal audit an auditor is appointed by the college management. Responsibility of conducting internal audit is given to the department of commerce. This year Shri Ajay Kumar Raja, Asst. Professor (Commerce) fulfilled the duties of conducting internal audit.

External Audit- For the purpose of the external audit, an external auditor is appointed by State CAG Officer who is also a government employee. External audit has been done till 2022. The audit of other financial accounts like UGC/RUSA/JBS/SF is carried out by hiring a charted accountant every year, and it is update until 2022.

Like every Higher Education Institute, this college has structured optimal utilization and mobilization process of fund. DDO gets funds from various resources and asks various committees (Sports, Library, hod's) for the needed articles, distributes funds accordingly. And then follows the Chhattisgarh Store Purchase Rule and purchase procedure. The purchase committee of the college demands quotations and tenders from various vendors and makes comparative studies of tenders, then gives a suggestion to the principal for purchase order with terms and conditions and finally College Principal give order and pays through the treasury or cheque.

Covid 19: During Covid pandemic free sanitizers, masks, food packets were distributed to the needy persons. NSS and NCC students also offered their helping hands to quarantine centers, vaccination centers and infected patients. Under *Padhai Tuhar Dwar* program NSS students gave free tutorial to the students at their home.

Celebration: Celebration of independence Day, Republic Day, Gandhi Jayanti, National Unity Day, Constitutional Day, Human Rights Day, National Voters Day, National Youth Day.

SVEEP Program: In SVEEP program NSS students are given training, which they further, gives training to local citizens on the importance of voting rights. 1st Best Practice

1. Title - Effort to develop clean and green campus with sustainable management.

2. Objectives-

At Government MahaprabhuVallabhachairya PG College in Mahasamund, we strive to provide a learning environment that emphasises compassion and ethical behaviour. In the spirit of Mahatma Gandhi, who coined the phrase "cleanliness is Godliness" and our honourable Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who launched the "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" inspired by Mahatma Gandhi, the institution should play a significant role in acting as a community to meet the needs of society. To promote a sustainable and eco-friendly environment, our college started the green campus programme.

3. The context

The college's students and faculty are aware of how to safeguard the environment by using less single-use plastics, paper and cloth bags as alternatives to plastics, and taking part in environmental programmes. The fundamental goal of the Green Campus with sustainable development initiative is to guarantee that there will be enough water and other resources for upcoming generations. However, to maximize its effectiveness, the > primary challenge is to successfully implement education for sustainable development. The appropriate balance of economic, social, and environmental factors should be taken into account and maintained for any new development.

4. The Practice

Our college has supported numerous initiatives that aim to save the environment and preserve its natural resources. Despite the fact that it is technically prohibited, the college keeps a green garden and annually plants fresh trees. Our college initiated to making "*Seeds Balls*" which is great approach for growing plants in unexpected places. Seed Balls can be thrown into the garden or anywhere we like when it rains the water should get into the Balls and the Seeds will germinate and creating new plants. Vermicomposting has been used by the college to solve its waste disposal issue. From the solid waste the college canteen produces, vermi-composting pits are utilised to create compost for college landscaping.

Tree planting marked the start of the green campus effort. Up-to 2000 trees have been planted in our college's campus, which is a significant accomplishment. A floral, ornamental, and medicinal plant section has also been constructed in our college's botanical garden. It is really impressive and successful that so many students participate in the various awareness campaigns our college sponsors. From this efforts, our College is the recipient of "*GREEN CHAMPION AWARD*" issued by Mahatma Gandhi National Council for Rural Education, Department of Higher Education, and Govt. Of India. The award has been given for generating and maintaining greenery in the college campus. Asst. Professor Saraswati Seth has gone under five day faculty development program organized by MGNCRE and she has been appointed as "*District Sustainability Mentor*" for promoting Sustainability in college campus and nearby villages of Mahasamund district for few months.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The creation and upkeep of appropriate infrastructure for environmentally friendly operations is the key issue facing the green campus effort. Our continuing environmental endeavours have been negatively impacted by the coronavirus pandemic. A succession of awareness programmes are required to educate and prepare more individuals for the implementation of green practises. Becoming green requires not only financial investment, but also a strong commitment from all the beneficiaries to be successful and praiseworthy.

1. Title: "Encouraging Girls' Education".

2. Objectives

Through community mobilization, our college works additional focused on to develop an good educational system for girl's students that will increase access and encourage enrollment in higher education for the residents of Mahasamund's district economically and socially underdeveloped rural areas. Support and support females who wish to pursue higher education so that they can become independent thinkers and self-learners, acquire the knowledge and skills necessary for their lives and careers.

3. The context

One of the most crucial elements for the development of one's social and autonomous self is education. Girls who acquire an education are more likely to lead healthy, fulfilling lives and are less likely to marry early. They create better futures for themselves and their family, earn higher wages, and take part in decisions that most directly affect them. Our college goes above and above to give female students the greatest possible educational opportunity.

4. The Practice

Our college abides by government initiatives for girls' education, including "Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao," the National Scheme and Family Welfare's programme to encourage adolescent girls in rural areas to practise good menstrual hygiene, among others. We also conduct CG government scheme "Padhai Tuhar Dwar" in Covid-19 Pendemic duration to overcome the loss of education. The females who are denied regular entry due to a lack of seats are given the additional support of being allowed to attend the class with a special permit. Our college continuously organised skill development programs especially for girl's students. During the academic session different carrier guidance program is also run by College Carrier Guidance committee. Our college provide a platform to different coaching institute conduct scholarship exams for the various competitive examinations. We also motivate to girls student to apply summer project work in India's best institute.

5. Evidence of Success

This practice has promoted girls' students' education since the college faculty works hard to create the best educational environment for their female students. The majority of the female students were from workingand middle-class farming families. Our organization follows the "Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Abhiyan" in this way. The number of female students has increased as a result of this programme and getting high marks in their final exam and taking place in merit list of university. Many female students are encourages to pursue in higher education. Some girls are getting jobs through the CGPSC or VYAPAM exam. The college is renowned for enrolling a sizable number of female students.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The seating arrangements for class discussions and for books are the main issues that the encouraging girl's classmates run into. Our facility for offering study seating configurations is a classroom. In order to accommodate seating for students, remove the number of tables and increase the number of chairs. They are also permitted to study in the library. Our college lecturers visit the nearby schools to inform and motivate our female students to pursue higher education.
